Labor & Delivery

- Your birth plan.
- Your insurance card and any hospital paperwork you need.
- Eyeglasses
- A hair band/hair ties.
- □ Lip moisturizer/balm.
- Toiletries
- A bathrobe, nightgown, slippers, and a couple of pairs of socks.
- □ Flip Flop/Shower Shoes
- Something to read, if you're so inclined. (InStyle, Vogue, People)
- Massage oils or lotions
- Extra pillow w/ patterned case.
- □ Tennis balls/rice pad.
- Music/ipod/cd player.
- DVD PLAYER/DVDs (for long labor).
- Notepad/journal/pen/pencils.

For Partner

- Money/coins for parking and change for vending machines.
- □ Toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant.
- A change of clothes, overnight clothes
- Some snacks and something to read during the early stages.
- A camera/video camera and film or tape or a memory card and batteries. Camera charger.
- A bathing suit. If your partner wants to take a bath or shower during labor, you may want to jump in with her.
- Laptop

Post-partum

A fresh nightgown.

- Snacks! So bring your own crackers, trail mix, raisins, and energy bars/juice, lollipops/mints.
- A nursing bra, breast pads, and (4-5) underwear.
- □ Toothbrush, toothpaste, hairbrush, shampoo/conditioner, deodorant(travel size).
- Call family/friends list and prepaid phone card or cell phone(charger).
- A going-home outfit:Sweats/sweatshirt/tshirt/socks. Flat shoes.
- Boppy
- Tush cush
- Nipple cream.
- Bring along plastic bags (like shopping bags) and put dirty clothes in those.
- Bring extra clothes for you and your spouse, because that beautiful child will not waste anytime trying to pee on you.
- Thank you cards/token gifts for nursing staff

Baby

- An infant car seat w/ head support.
- □ 3-4 diapers
- Nightgown/socks or booties.
- □ A going-home outfit (one-piece stretchy outfits are easiest).
- A receiving blanket (a heavy one if the weather's cold).
- A pair of socks or booties.
- □ A cap/hat.
- Baby nail clippers or emery board.
